20. Mosaki Rukle, the 15th day of November 1785

I, Jan Napierkowski CRL pastor of Krasne: a Marriage
Contract between the Nobles Tomasz Niedziałkowski, an
unmarried man from the village of Klonowe of the
Pałucene Parish, and Cecilia Chotkowska, an unmarried
girl from the village of Mosaki Rukle of the Krasne
Parish, immediately following the presentation of three
banns before the people to the divine audience of the
congregation made in the Krasne Parish Church as well as
in the Pałucene Parish Church in order that no testimony
shown on either part stands as an impediment being free
in appearance the Church confirms and blesses. The
witnesses present were the noble Adam Łyczkowski, the
noble Stanisław Milewski, and the noble Wiktor
Chrzanowski, and a number of others.
