I, Konstanty Niedzialkowski, hereby filed, respectfully shows

that I was born in Pomocki, Lomza, Poland, Oct. 28, 1892 My race is Polish

and I have been in Worcester, Mass. since April 27, 1935 in the Superior

Massachusetts Court of Worcester

and I have been married. The name of my wife or husband is Helen Niedzialkowski

and she was born in Likiski, Vilna, Lithuania on Feb. 15, 1897 and she entered the United States

at New York, N.Y. on Jan. 14, 1913 for permanent residence therein, and now

resides at Worcester, Mass. I have 5 children, and the names, date

of birth, and place of residence of each of said children are as follows: Natalie, Feb. 4, 1920; Raymond

8, 1921; Jane, Oct. 6, 1922; Fred, May 26, 1924; Henry, May 9, 1926.

children born and now living at Worcester, Mass.

My last foreign residence was Pomocki, Lomza, Poland I emigrated to the United States of

America at Rotterdam, Netherlands My lawful entry for permanent residence in the United States

was on May 24, 1910 at New York, N.Y. under the name of Niedzialkoski, Konstanti

and I arrived on the vessel SS Ryndam

and I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed

to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States

and I am disposed to the good order and happiness of the United States. It is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and

solemnly and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND

and UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS

in which at this time I am a subject (or citizen), and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States. (8) I am able to speak the English language.

I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of 5 years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since

May 24, 1910 and in the County of Worcester

and continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since May 24, 1910 being a residence within said county of at least

one year next preceding the date of this petition.
