

NOTE.—The officer before whom the testimony is taken should call the attention of the witness to the following section of the Revised Statutes, and state to him that it is the purpose of the Government, if it be ascertained that he testifies falsely, to prosecute him to the full extent of the law.

TITLE LXX.—CRIMES.—CH. 4.

SEC. 5392 Every person who, having taken an oath before a competent tribunal, officer, or person, in any case in which a law of the United States authorizes an oath to be administered, that he will testify, declare, depose, or certify truly, or that any written testimony, declaration, deposition, or certificate by him subscribed is true, willfully and contrary to such oath states or subscribes any material matter which he does not believe to be true, is guilty of perjury, and shall be punished by a fine of not more than two thousand dollars, and by imprisonment, at hard labor, not more than five years, and shall, moreover, thereafter be incapable of giving testimony in any court of the United States until such time as the judgment against him is reversed. Final Affidavit Required of Homestead Claimants.

SECTION 2291 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF THE UNITED STATES.

I, Antoni Jarowski, having made a Homestead entry of the SE 1/4 of SE 4 and Lots 3 & 4 of section No. 17 in Township No. 52 N of range No. 14 W 4th P.M., subject to entry at Duluth Minn. under section No. 2289 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, do now apply to perfect my claim thereto by virtue of section No. 2291 of the Revised Statutes of the United States; and for that purpose do solemnly swear that I am a citizen of the United States; that I have made actual settlement upon and have cultivated said land, having resided thereon since the 15th day of February, 1877, to the present time; that no part of said land has been alienated, except as provided in section 2288 of the Revised Statutes, but that I am the sole *bona fide* owner as an actual settler; that I will bear true allegiance to the Government of the United States; and further, that I have not heretofore perfected or abandoned an entry made under the homestead laws of the United States.

HOMESTEAD PROOF.—TESTIMONY OF CLAIMANT.

Antoni Jarnowski being called as a witness in his own behalf in support of homestead entry No. 1396, for the S² of S²E² & Lots 3 & 4, Sec. 17, T²P. 52, N. R. 14, W. 4, 4th Coll. testifies as follows:

Ques. 1.—What is your name—written in full and correctly spelled—your age, and post-office address?

Ans. *Antoni Jarnowski* age 52 years. P.O. address *Duluth St. Louis County, Minnesota*

Ques. 2.—Are you a native of the United States, or have you been naturalized?

Ans. *I am a Naturalized Citizen of the United States*

Ques. 3.—When was your house built on the land and when did you establish actual residence therein? (Describe said house and other improvements which you have placed on the land, giving total value thereof.)

Ans. *On July 15th 1877 and established my residence on that date. I have a good 2 1/2 story house 20 x 30 feet high single roof a good board floor 2 doors 5 windows 2 stoves & other household furniture, a barn. about 8 acres of land cleared cultivated and fenced. Value about \$700 or*

Ques. 4.—Of whom does your family consist; and have you and your family resided continuously on the land since first establishing residence thereon? (If unmarried, state the fact.)

Ans. *Myself wife and five children. I have resided continuously on the land except when I went to work at Duluth and to get some provisions*

Ques. 5.—For what period or periods have you been absent from the homestead since making settlement, and for what purpose; and if temporarily absent, did your family reside upon and cultivate the land during such absence?

Ans. *I have not been absent except a short time in the summer time at work on the docks at Duluth the longest time I was absent was about 3 months or in all together in a year and only in the summer time. I am a poor man and I have to work for wages in order to support myself & family on the claim. My family would sometimes go with me to Duluth and at other times they would stay & take care of my claim.*

Ques. 6.—How much of the land have you cultivated and for how many seasons have you raised crops thereon?

Ans. *About 8 acres. and raised crops for six seasons.*

Ques. 7.—Are there any indications of coal, salines, or minerals of any kind on the land? (If so, describe what they are, and state whether the land is more valuable for agricultural than for mineral purposes.)

Ans. *No not that I know of.*

Ques. 8.—Have you ever made any other homestead entry? (If so, describe the same.)

Ans. *No*

Ques. 9.—Have you sold, conveyed, or mortgaged any portion of the land; and if so, to whom and for what purpose?

Ans. *No*

NOTE.—If naturalized, the claimant must file a certified copy of his certificate of naturalization. In a commuted homestead a foreign-born claimant, if not naturalized, must file a certified copy of his declaration of intention. In making proof, the party must surrender his original duplicate receipt, or file affidavit of its loss.

HOMESTEAD PROOF—TESTIMONY OF WITNESS.

Stanislaw Koslakowicz being called as witness in support of the Homestead entry of Antoni Jarnowski for the S 1/2 of S 2 E 4 and Lots 3 & 4 Sec. 17 Township 5 S. R. of R. - 14 - T. 4 P. 10 R. 10 E. testifies as follows:

Ques. 1.—What is your occupation and where is your residence?

Ans. a Farmer - I reside in the same Township as Claimant

Ques. 2.—Have you been well acquainted with Antoni Jarnowski, the claimant, in this case ever since he made his homestead entry No. 1394 ..

Ans. Yes -

Ques. 3.—Was claimant qualified to make said entry? (State whether the settler was a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, or the head of a family, and whether he ever made a former homestead entry.)

Ans. Yes - He is a naturalized citizen of the United States and a married man and has never made a former homestead entry.

Ques. 4.—When did claimant settle upon the homestead and at what date did he establish actual residence thereon?

(Describe the dwelling and other improvements, giving total value thereof.)

Ans. He settled on January 15th 1877 and established his residence on July 15th 1877. He has built a log house 20 x 30 feet one story high with good shingle roof, good floor two doors & 5 windows, 2 stoves & other household furniture. He has a barn. He has cleared, cultivated and fenced 8 acres of the land. Value of improvements about \$700.

Ques. 5.—Have claimant and family resided continuously on the homestead since first establishing residence thereon?

(If settler is unmarried, state the fact.)

Ans. Yes - except that he went sometimes to Duluth to work and to buy provisions. He is a poor man.

Ques. 6.—For what period or periods has the settler been absent from the land since making settlement, and for what purpose; and if temporarily absent, did claimant's family reside upon and cultivate the land during such absence?

Ans. He was sometimes absent from a week to three months working on the docks at Duluth and to get provisions for himself and family. Some times his family went with him & at other times

Ques. 7.—How much of the homestead has the settler cultivated and for how many seasons did he raise crops thereon?

Ans. He has about 8 acres cultivated and raised crops for six seasons.

Ques. 8.—Are there any indications of coal, salines, or minerals of any kinds on the homestead? (If so, describe what they are, and state whether the land is more valuable for agricultural than for mineral purposes.)

Ans. Not that I know of.

Ques. 9.—Has the claimant mortgaged, sold, or contracted to sell, any portion of said homestead?

Ans. No -

Ques. 10.—Are you interested in this claim; and do you think the settler has acted in entire good faith in perfecting this entry?

Ans. No - and do think he has acted in good faith.

Value of improvement about \$700. He has a barn & his claim paid

Ans. He has about 8 acres cleared & cultivated and raised crops. His reasons

Ques. 8.—Are there any indications of coal, salines, or minerals of any kinds on the homestead? (If so, describe what they are, and state whether the land is more valuable for agricultural than for mineral purposes.)

Ans. None that I know of

Ques. 9.—Has the claimant mortgaged, sold, or contracted to sell, any portion of said homestead?

Ans. No

Ques. 10.—Are you interested in this claim; and do you think the settler has acted in entire good faith in perfecting this entry?

Ans. I have no interest in the claim and think he has acted in good faith
